We look forward and give thanks

Sharing bread and wine

Jesus shared the Passover meal with his disciples as they remembered their ancestors' deliverance from Egypt.

Jesus spent that evening with friends who would be transformed by his life, death and resurrection.

This evening we ask by the power of the Holy Spirit that we may share in the same story and that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us his body and blood.

On the night he was betrayed Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it and gave it to his disciples saying - "Take eat, this is my body which is given for you."

After supper he took the cup, gave God thanks and said to his disciples - "This is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you"

Together we proclaim:

Christ has died

Christ is Risen

Christ will come again

Come to Christ's table and eat and drink
With the disciples in the gospels
With the saints who have inspired us
With the memory of those we have lost
With those who are here this evening.

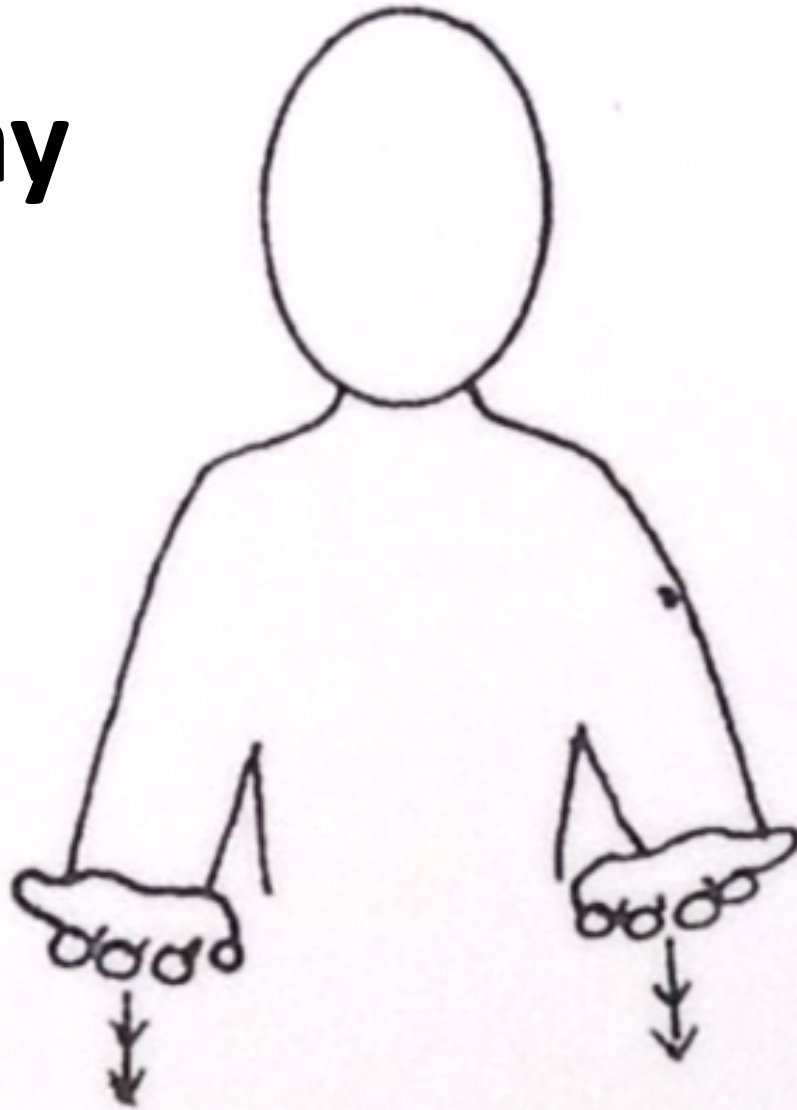
